PATIENT HISTORY

A 56 year old healthy male presented to my office on 10/23/2014. A thorough examination revealed pocket depths ranging from 3-9mm. There were moderate to heavy accretions and generalized inflammation with bleeding upon gentle probing. The implant at #30 had suppuration. This implant was placed 3 years earlier by a dentist in Florida.

TREATMENT APPROACH

Initial preparation done over two visits including scaling and root planing and oral hygiene instructions. The patient moved to Florida and didn't return to our office until a year later. There was essentially no change in his periodontal status.

On 11/9/2015, LANAP therapy was performed and LAPIP for the ailing implant at #30. Initial probing depths were as follows: Buccal 7-7-7 and Lingual 10-6-7 from distal to mesial. 185 Joules were delivered around the implant during treatment.

RESULTS

The patient followed up with us sporadically, as he lived in Florida full time. At his last maintenance visit on 11/13/2017, the tissue tone was excellent with minimal bleeding upon probing and pocket depths within normal ranges. The implant has a residual 5mm distal pocket and does not bleed when probed.
